Universal Level Training

Universal (Group 1 & 2): This is mandatory for all staff in regular contact with children and young people and adults who are parents or carers.

Introduction to Safeguarding Children and Young People

Learning Objectives:

1. Develop your understanding of safeguarding children and young people in local and national contexts.
2. Develop your awareness of potential indicators of abuse and neglect.
3. Know what to do if a child or young person discloses that they are experiencing or at risk of abuse or neglect, or if you are concerned that they are experiencing or at risk of abuse or neglect.
4. Know how to record and share information effectively.

Targeted Level Training

Targeted (Group 3 & 4): Safeguarding Children a Shared Responsibility. Mandatory for all staff who work *predominantly* with children, young people and families, and who may be asked to contribute to assessments of children in need.

Multi-Agency Safeguarding: A Shared Responsibility

1. Develop your understanding of research and legislation relating to safeguarding children and young people.
2. Understand your responsibilities as a designated safeguarding lead, or other professional with responsibility for safeguarding, and the responsibilities of other partner agencies.
3. Develop your understanding of the importance of effective information sharing, communication, challenging unconscious bias and multi-agency working.
4. Develop your knowledge of safeguarding policy, referral processes and pathways in Bracknell Forest.
5. Understand the importance of evidencing the voice of the child.
6. Develop your understanding of factors impacting on parenting capacity, risk and protective factors and how to engage resistant or disguised compliant families.

Specialist Level Training

Safeguarding Disabled Children by Talking Life

Learning Objectives:

1. Describe the circumstances which make disabled children vulnerable to abuse.
2. Understand how to work within the social model of disability.
3. Develop skills in assessing the signs and indicators presented by disabled children who may have been subjected to abuse.
4. Consider how to plan their work with disabled children taking account of their communication needs.
5. Understand how to work effectively with disabled children within the procedures for safeguarding children from harm.
6. Understand how to ensure that interventions remain focused on the best interests of the child whilst working in complex situations where there are many competing demands and priorities.
7. Develop skills in working within complex multi-agency networks to ensure that risks are assessed, and interventions meet the needs of the child.

Fabricated and Induced Illness by Beacon Hill Training

Learning Objectives:

1. To look at definitions and explore how Fabricated illness occurs, develops and escalates.
2. To explore the range of behaviours that may be presented by the caregiver.
3. To consider the professionals role and involvement
4. To look at the obstacles professional's barriers to identification of Fabricated Illness and the professional's responsibilities.
5. To look at building evidence and sharing information.
6. To give participants the practical skills, knowledge and information to take action to safeguard the child effectively.

5. Identify what help is available in Bracknell forest for clients experiencing Domestic Abuse.
